**The New Jim Crow Project** – MCC designed this material for small groups and Sunday school classes. The program guides you through the history and implementation of mass incarceration in the U.S. and provides actions and solutions.

**With the Word: A Bible Study and Devotional Guide for Groups or Individuals** - We draw closer to God when we spend time with the Word. This new Bible study and devotional series explores specific books of the Bible from an Anabaptist perspective. ‘With the Word Series’ includes the following choices: Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts, Genesis, Isaiah, Psalms.

**Christian. Muslim. Friend: Twelve Paths to Real Relationship** - Can Christians and Muslims be friends? Real friends? Even in an era of intense religious conflict, David Shenk says yes. In *Christian. Muslim. Friend.*, Shenk lays out twelve ways that

Christians can form authentic relationships with Muslims—characterized by respect, hospitality, and candid dialogue—while still bearing witness to the Christ-centered commitments of their faith.

**The Gospel Next Door: Following Jesus Right Where You Are** - As Christians, we pray for God’s kingdom to come “on earth as it is in heaven.” But what does that even mean? Would we recognize God’s kingdom if it moved in next door? With stories from his own city of Houston, Texas, author Marty Troyer introduces a theology of place that empowers us to truly see the work of God where we live, work, and play.
