MCC & Gaza: With famine imminent in Gaza, MCC has delivered a critical truckload of emergency food for besieged families. As part of a convoy of other trucks transporting humanitarian relief via Jordan, the vehicle sat for more than a week waiting to cross the border. It finally made its way through the Kerem Abu Salem crossing into Gaza on March 19. MCC partner Al-Najd Developmental Forum (Al-Najd) received the lifesaving delivery from the first of six planned truckloads, including locally purchased food such as chickpeas, lentils, rice, flour, cooking oil, canned meat, fish and beans. The packages will be delivered to 665 displaced families currently living in tent camps in Deir al Balah and other locations between Gaza City and Rafah, known as the "Middle Area" of the Gaza Strip. It's harder for families living in the Middle Area to access humanitarian relief than it is for those who fled further south. "The process for getting the goods into Gaza has been full of ups and downs," says Sarah Funkhouser, MCC representative for Jordan, Palestine and Israel along with her husband Seth Malone. "We've been blessed to work with a great partner in Jordan, but the restrictions imposed by the Israeli authorities have caused delays difficult to work around."
