Thank you for helping to make meat canning another successful year and for all the support! It was good being back in Milford again after 3 of the last 4 years being in Newton, KS. The final total of 15,954 pounds of chicken thigh meat resulted in 10,259 cans. The price of chicken meat dropped a little this year from \$1.86 to \$1.53 per pound, but we canned about 2000 pounds more since we were back in Milford but still about 2000# less than the 18,000 we have normally done in Milford. The canning committee wanted to make sure that we had enough donations to be able to can more meat in Milford and we did! Thank you!!! The canning committee also agreed to send an extra donation to MCC meat canning of \$6647.96 since our ending balance has remained high. # Lent 2023

With our Ash Wednesday service this past week, we as the church have now entered the season of Lent. In the Lenten Season we begin to focus more on the life, teachings, and passion of Jesus as we journey alongside him to the cross on Good Friday, and celebrate his resurrection on Easter Sunday. Our sermon theme for Lent is three-fold. Created in the image of God, Shaped by Jesus, Called by the Spirit. Each Sunday of Lent, we will explore different ways in which we have been created, shaped, and called.

As a part of this, you may notice that the cross is draped with different colors of cloth. The colors were chosen to reflect the theme for each Sunday: red for testing/temptation, orange for new birth (sunrise), blue for water, yellow for light, green for life, purple for worship and Palm Sunday, black for Good Friday. As we progress through Lent, each Sunday a layer of cloth will be removed to reveal more of what is underneath. This serves as a visual reminder of what we are moving towards through each week of Lent.

Each and every person of FMC is hereby invited (maybe even challenged) to create a piece of art (painting, craft, sculpture, etc.) connected to one of the Lenten or Easter worship themes for this year.
