First Mennonite Immigrant Resettlement Ministry February to July, 2022

This afternoon my goal was to write "Thank you" notes for the recent mid-month food deliveries and additional acts of kindness. I soon realized this ministry has <u>grown</u> beyond individual "Thank you" notes. Your response to this ministry has been off the charts! With this bulletin insert may I back up and tell you how you became involved, and what your involvement has done for people who were homeless and now have apartments to live in.

February 8th, 2022, I received a call from the hospital to translate for a lady who had just given birth to her first child. This Nicaraguan couple arrived in Beatrice on Feb. 5th and were also homeless. We had to find them an apartment by the end of the month or they would have to go to a homeless shelter in Lincoln. On Feb. 27 an apartment was located and they moved in with just a bare mattress and a few items to cook with. The family they had been living with did not have a single chair in their apartment. It became apparent very quickly to Dale and me that this situation was bigger than either one of us. We needed help. We called Jim Ensz and during our visit we heard of your interest in sponsoring a refugee family into the Beatrice community. I asked if the church would consider changing the name and begin sponsoring the Nicaraguan Immigrants already in Beatrice. After consulting with the church, Jim agreed to be the contact person and First Mennonite has become an incredible team. Your idea of making mid-month food deliveries have helped the families and the local Food Pantry. (In June the pantry had to purchase \$7,000 worth of food to meet Pantry needs.) We are relating to members from seven different families. They are living at four different locations but as the other

family members make the trip, they will begin finding apartments for their families.

Each person must present him or herself before the Immigration Court in Omaha during their first year in the US. They have to have a lawyer who will represent them. Pastor Ardon Dorn from St. John Lutheran introduced us to Jamie and Jesus Arango from Arango Law Office in Lincoln. One family has met with this lawyer and are starting their legal paper work. In the near future we will be asking for people from First Mennonite to consider giving rides to the court appearances in Omaha and then rides to Lincoln, as the lawyer needs to meet with them in person.

First Mennonite, your response to this ministry now gives me time to make home visits but I always have time for your questions or needs. My number is 402 806 0111. We receive our backing for this ministry from Hebrews 13:1-3 *"Never let your brotherly love fail, nor refuse to extend your <u>hospitality</u> to <u>strangers</u>—sometimes men have entertained angels unawares ...Think too of all who suffer as if you shared their pain" J.B. Phillips New Testament.*
