August 2-4, 2024 at First Mennonite Church, Beatrice, NE we'll worship, work, eat yummy local food, enjoy a Family Festival for all ages, connect with new & old friends, experience faith formation for all ages, and have many choices of great workshops. We hope you'll agree Annual Assembly is a great place to learn about and grow in faith in Christ in Anabaptist community, care for the broader church, and worship our God of love and justice with God's

people in Western District Conference!

Assembly Theme: "In Community We Transform." We will explore Romans 12, asking what authentic Anabaptist Christian community looks and sounds like. How are we called to be transformed as followers of Jesus today? As we hear the concerns and joys of all of us in Western District Conference, we will explore what it means to respond to one another and the world with God's mercy, justice, and love.

Two Tracks: This year we'll have two different "tracks" going on at the same time. The Delegate Track is for those who are sent to Assembly as church representatives to help make decisions on behalf of our conference. The Faith Formation Track is for everybody else (except kids 3 and under) at Summit Street Church in town. Sarah Neher, Associate Pastor of Faith Formation and others will lead adults, youth, and school aged kids in a fun, creative multigenerational faith formation experience. She will also begin with an introduction for adults as to how we can do intergenerational faith formation well in our own congregations. Then there will be fun things—music, bible stories, art, and more—to do together with all ages. Vans will transport people who need it.

Family Festival! Saturday evening will be full of fun for all ages. There will be carnival-style games outside under tents provided by our ministry partners and homemade ice cream to enjoy. Cards and board games inside.

Church Delegates - This year's **Delegate Session** on Saturday, Aug 3, will be hybrid (both in-person & Virtual). Each virtual delegate will need to have the ability to join via Zoom on their own (not shared) device. On-site delegate work will be shared with virtual delegates via special conferencing technology.

All in attendance must register and pay the registration fee. In-Person Registration is all-inclusive (except for housing)! Your adult registration of \$100 includes Saturday lunch, BBQ supper and snacks, as well as access to workshops, worship and the delegate session or intergenerational faith formation.
