Vision, Calling and Witness: Round Table Discussions Regarding God's Call to Future Ministries May 1- 29

Though repairs to our sanctuary during the month of May forces us to meet for worship in Fellowship Hall for a time, this situation also gives our congregation the opportunity to worship in a more informal way. The Worship Council and Church Board agreed that this would be a good time to revisit our Round Table discussion format and consider what ministries God might be calling us as a congregation to pursue in the coming days and years. This will be valuable discernment to guide our ministry together with our new settled pastor as we share the good news of Jesus with our community and our world.

When **Dave Boshart** visited our congregation last January, Dave challenged us to think of **Vision**, **Values and Vocation** in calling both lay and ordained leadership for our congregation. Dave also led a stimulating meeting over lunch with a number of our church leaders. After that meeting, Dave shared with us a paper he wrote several years ago, outlining six unique opportunities that rural congregations have to share **God's good news**.

Our Round Table Discussions will highlight some of these opportunities and include several other that relevant to our future. We have called on various leaders in our congregation, as well as Pastor Roger, to present these opportunities, linking them with ways God called people in the Bible to ministries in their time and place. (see the schedule on the other side of this sheet.) Our children's stories will help both young and old to consider the topic of the day, with our children sometimes presenting their own ideas of things our church could do.

We will plan for the first part of our service to last about 45 minutes. We will then end the recording of our service with a hymn and dismiss the children to some age-appropriate activities (see the schedule below). The adults and youth will continue with 5-15 minutes of round table discussions, then 5-15 minutes of discussion as a whole group. We will end our worship with the Lord's Prayer and a benediction.
